

2018 MONTHLY TAX DISCOUNTS / PENALTIES:

For prompt payment of 2018 taxes the following discounts are allowed:

- Payments received in January 6.5% discount
- Payments received in February 5.5% discount
- Payments received in March 4% discount
- Payments received in April 3% discount
- Payments received in May 2% discount
- Payments received in June 1% discount
- Payments received in July .5% discount



Penalties for 2018 Tax arrears will be as follows:

August 1 (compounded monthly)	1%
September 1	1%
October 1	1%
November 1	1%
December 1	1%

On January 1, 2018 a 12% penalty will be applied to 2017 arrears

Taxes are imposed the first day of January in each year and are due July 31.

Please remember there is NO discount for the School Portion of Taxes

Tax Estimate Notices for 2018 taxes were sent in mid December 2017. 2018 Tax Notices will be sent mid May, once the School Division levies have been established and the Municipal Mill Rate has been set.

NEW: ANIMAL CONTROL BYLAW – Bylaw 07-17

There will **NO LONGER** be free registrations for cats or dogs for the month of January! A **permanent license** will now be required for **all cats and dogs**. A **ONE TIME FEE OF \$25.00** for the lifetime of the cat or dog (due by Jan. 31/18) must be accompanied with the 2018 registration form. If you've already completed a form in 2017 and there are no changes, you will then no longer be required to complete an annual registration. Failure to register a cat or dog can result in fines of \$100 per animal for the first offence. Please see our website for the full Bylaw 07-17.

Utility, Tax, & General Receipting

As of Jan. 1/18, the Town Office will no longer be mailing receipts, in an attempt to save postage costs. In 2016 over \$6,500 was spent on sending invoices and receipts alone. All e-transfers automatically send an acceptance receipt and online payments are recorded on your bank statement. For any residents paying by cash or cheque a receipt will be mailed to you should you require it for record keeping purposes.

For those of you that have not yet signed up for e-billing please contact the Town Office for a consent form.

Helpful tips to save water and money!

- If all the earth's water is represented by a 4L jug, only about 30 mL – less than 1% - would be the easily accessible freshwater required to support all human needs including industry, agriculture, drinking and washing.
- A low-flow showerhead saves as much as 10 L of water per minute.
- Keep a jug of water in the fridge. This eliminates the need to run the tap until it's cold, saving 7-12 L of water per minute.
- Run the dishwasher and washing machine only when they're fully loaded. Each unnecessary load wastes 70-190 L of water.
- Your tap uses 7-12 L of water per minute while it runs, so turn off while shaving and brushing your teeth.
- Try taking shorter showers. This can save between 6-19 L of water per minute.
- A new, water-efficient toilet can save as much as 14 L of water per flush compared to an older model. This can save up to 70 L of water per person, per day.
- Save 6-30 L of water per flush by only flushing when necessary and avoid using the toilet as a wastebasket.
- Regularly check your faucets, pipes and toilets for leaks. If found, have the leaks fixed as soon as possible to avoid further waste.

**2018 BUSINESS LICENSE
- Bylaw No. 12-14**

The Town of Aberdeen Bylaw 12-14 requires all businesses whether store front, home based, any trades or professions to obtain a Business License.

All businesses must register with the Town of Aberdeen annually. Failure to do so may result in fines. **Local businesses** and **non-local** trades are subject to 2018 fees. **All current local businesses MUST be registered by January 31, 2018.**

The Provincial Fire Centre If a passing motorist phones in to report a fire that you have not registered with the Municipality and the Provincial Fire Center, we will be forced to fine you \$500. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, all costs will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire.

Transfer Station

RM ratepayers wishing to use the Transfer Station must have a User Card (available at the RM office during regular business hours). Cards are only valid from January 1st -December 31st of the year they were issued and must be renewed annually. Open Wednesday and Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Located on the SW 12-39-03-W3. The transfer site has a waste disposal bin for *household refuse* which is not recyclable or burnable. The site is manned and the gate is locked at all times, except during operating hours as indicated. There is a \$500.00 fine for anyone caught dumping garbage in the municipality, and the municipality will prosecute anyone that fails to pay the fine. The Transfer Station does *not* accept old propane tanks, bale wrap/netting or grain bags. The RM of Blucher is allowing ratepayers from the RM of Aberdeen (with valid user cards) to use the waste transfer station located at NW 24-36-03-W3. The RM of Aberdeen will be covering the cost to use this station. The list of accepted items applies to both transfer stations.

Taxes

2017 Tax Notices were mailed out in July 2017. Taxes are due on or before December 31, 2017. All payments must be received or the envelope date stamped by Canada Post prior to the last day of the month. Please be advised that a 1% interest charge is added on to overdue taxes on the first of every month.

Civic Addressing

Civic addressing signs will be ordered in the new year. The civic address will be used by emergency response teams; it is not yet recognized by mail delivery companies including Canada Post. Your civic address can be found on your Tax Notice or can be obtained by contacting the RM office.
