



The City of Saskatoon has imposed a 13% increase in water rates to Sk Water. In turn Sk Water will be passing on a 9.75% increase to Aberdeen effective May 2019. Please watch for updates as to how this could affect our rates going forward.

BUILDING PERMITS

Building season is upon us. Please remember that building and development permits are required and can be picked up at the Town Office. Our maintenance staff do not do pin locates, please contact the office for a list of surveyors.

Glimpses into the past, 2018...and beyond...

...Spring is soon upon us and 2018 has come to a close! In 2018 we received a total of 10 new Building/Development permits ranging from Fences, Decks, Garages, Basement Development, 1 Shop and 1 New Single Family Dwelling. We have seen our community grow by 70 new homes in the last 12 yrs. We were excited to see part of our 207 Main Street office space rented to Gentil Photography. We held our 1st Annual Town Supper, and are planning to engage our community again this year. Our \$3,000,000 lagoon/lift station project is approximately 93% complete. The Federal Government contributed \$1,500,000, Provincial \$750,000 and the Town of Aberdeen \$750,000. (Over \$400,000 from Town reserves and infrastructure fees were utilized, which left us to borrow \$200,000 over 3yrs. As mandated by the Federal/Provincial Governments we completed our Asset Management Plan. This included an assessment of all our sewer lines for a total of \$74,063.18. We were happy to receive a \$50,000 grant from the Federal Government to pay for the majority of this expense. Some RAS (Recycled Asphalt Shingle) product for dust control has already been applied to the streets with the balance to be spread this Spring. This was done at a very reasonable cost of \$60,000. The Water Distribution Plant was operating with a backup generator (old swather motor) and has now been replaced with a \$60,000, 35 KW gen set and will be operating shortly. Council is working on a Smoking Bylaw that will come into effect later this Spring. We developed a Tax Incentive Policy for New Businesses who construct, purchase a bldg that has been vacant for 1 yr, or expand/renovate an existing business. We are currently in the process of interviewing new Bylaw Enforcement Services. We continued to use our New Deal Gas Tax monies to pay down our Water Plant expansion debt. In 2019 we will pay off our final balance of \$30,252.93. The Town contributed to the Rec Center \$60,000 towards their outstanding loan, plus additional monies to cover their insurance and water/sewer. From our tax dollars they continue providing and promoting a healthier lifestyle through community recreational programming. We will be looking for new Infrastructure Funding in 2019 under the "Investing in Canada Plan". With only a 1 day water supply in our reservoir, we need to upgrade our current capacity to at least a 3 day supply. It has been my pleasure to serve you in the past and I look forward to 2019.

Our 2018 Tax Levy was \$616,529
As of Dec. 31/18 over \$190,000 in Municipal taxes were still outstanding and almost \$32,488 was owed to your local School Divisions.


To give our hard-working ice plant a break and some much-needed maintenance, (plus our residents to the north some summer quiet),






