



Taxes

2019 taxes were due on or before December 31, 2019. As of January 1st, all outstanding taxes will begin collecting a penalty of 1% per month. All payments must be received or the envelope date stamped by Canada Post on or before December 31st to

avoid penalty charges. All outstanding invoices from 2019 will be added to the taxes as arrears and will begin to accumulate penalty charges.

E-Transfers are Accepted

All payments will be applied to Tax accounts unless the office is notified otherwise. Please use security answer: rmaberdeen unless you notify the office of an alternate answer prior to processing your payment.

Plowing Snow

We would like to remind everyone that plowing snow onto or across municipal right-of-way is NOT a permitted practice. Guilty Parties will be subject to Fines.

Plowing snow across the roadways creates ridges that settle and harden, creating serious hazards to motorists, grader

operators, and potential damage to graders.

Animals Roaming at Large

Keeping animals within your property is the responsibility of the owner. If your animals are roaming within the RM, steps can be taken to detain the animals and all costs incurred in doing so will be the responsibility of the animals' owner.

Controlled Burn

With the drier than usual weather conditions, the RM council would like to remind everyone to take extreme caution while having a controlled burn. Don't forget to register your Controlled Burns

- Register with the municipality: call 306-253-4312 or 306-230-1603 after hours and weekends.
- Register with the Provincial Fire Center at 1-866-404-4911.

If a passing motorist reports a fire that you have not registered with the Municipality and the Provincial Fire Center, we will be forced to fine you \$500. If our fire department deems it necessary to call in fire fighters from neighboring municipalities, all costs will be forwarded to the person responsible for starting the fire. Please ensure you have proper Fire Fighting Insurance coverage.

Building Permits

Building permits are only valid for 12 months from the date on the permit. All expired permits must be closed in a timely manner. If an extension is required, please submit your request in writing along with your signature and the itemization of the work still required to be completed to the RM office.

PLEASE NOTE THAT MA INSPECTIONS HAS MERGED WITH BUILDTECH INSPECTION and BuildTECH will be taking over all open building permit files.

Pest Control Officer

As the weather turns colder, rats will be looking for a warm place to stay and a steady source of food. If you suspect a rat infestation on your property or on a neighbouring property, please call Denis, at 306-220-8996. Denis is conducting site visits and will be going around to all yard sites doing inspections. Rat poison can be picked up at the office during regular business hours.

Outstanding Invoices

All unpaid Invoices as of December 31st, 2019 will be applied to your tax account as arrears and are subject to a penalty of 1% per month.


COUNCIL'S CORNER

2020 Business Licenses

Business Licenses were due December 31,2019 for 2020. Fines will be issued if not paid immediately. According to Bylaw 12/14 the Business License Bylaw, all Home Based, Store Front and Contractor Business Licenses for 2020 are due December 31, 2019, and are valid until December 31, 2020.

License fees:

Home Based Business \$25 annually

Store Front Business \$75 annually

Contractor \$100 annually

General Contractor \$300 (covers the trades, as part of the building permit)

The offence for conducting business without a Business License is \$200. Bylaw Enforcement will be issuing fines for non-compliance.

Please note: We are experiencing issues at our new lift station due to oils, fats, hygiene products, wipes and misc. items being flushed down our sewer lines. Recently public works staff found miniature shampoo bottles, 2 to 3 feet thick chunks of fat around pipes and pumps. They have also found tennis balls, wire, pop cans and small toys.

When frying food any leftover grease can be chilled until it hardens and thrown out in the garbage.

This lift station has not even been operating for a year. These fixes are very costly....please do not dispose of these items down your drain. Thank you. Town of Aberdeen Public Works.







Outstanding Building Permits

There are a large number of outstanding building permits throughout the Town of Aberdeen. Many of these permits have construction deficiencies, which have still not been addressed, and some just need a final inspection. The Town is required by provincial legislation to enforce the National Building Code to ensure safe construction standards are met. Therefore, it is important for you to complete the work as listed on your last building inspection report from MuniCode Services and then call them at (306) 955-6355 to arrange a final inspection. If your project is not near completion and can't meet the 1-year permit deadline, please call the Town Office at (306) 253-4311 to ask for an extension to complete the project.

If you are unsure whether your property has any permits that have not been dealt with please check by calling the Town Office.

Please note: Should you go to sell your home these deficiencies and outstanding permits will come up on a Property Information Disclosure and could potentially stop the sale.


A few winter safety tips from your local fire department...

- Never leave burning candles and plugged in electric heaters unsupervised
- Check furnace filter monthly & replace filters as needed
- Never store flammable products around furnace or hot water tank.
- ➤ Ensure energy efficient furnace vents are not obstructed by any objects. Intake vents should be checked weekly for ice buildup.
- Only use clean well-seasoned (1-year) wood in wood burning stoves and fireplaces.
- Check and clean chimney regularly as needed.
- > Test smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors monthly push the test button.
- Smoke alarm and carbon monoxide batteries should be replaced yearly.
 - Smoke alarms should be replaced every 5 years
 - Carbon monoxide alarms replaced every 10 years or as per label on pkg.
- Check fire extinguisher for expiration date.




