



Meeting will start at 8:00 am. Council Meetings will not be open to public observation until further notice. Any delegations wishing to address the council will be required to contact the office the Friday prior to the meeting at the latest.

Office Closure

The RM office remains closed to the public; however, we continue to be open for business, and are committed to maintaining our ongoing work for our ratepayers. Should you wish to drop off a cheque for the payment of an invoice, please drop it in the drop slot on the outside of the office building and we will provide a receipt via mail.

Emergency Services

In case of an emergency please call 911. Ensure that you are familiar with your Civic Address and Land Location in order to aid the emergency services in a quick response time to your location.

Building Permits

Building permits are only valid for 12 months from the date on the permit. All expired permits must be closed in a timely manner. If an extension is required, please submit your request in writing along with your signature and the itemization of the work still required to be completed to the RM office. Please note that MA Inspections has merged with BuildTECH Consulting & Inspections Inc. and BuildTECH will be taking over all open building permit files. Call or Text Nicole at BuildTECH Inspections at 306-370-2824 to book your inspection.

Pest Control Officer

If you suspect a rat infestation on your property or on a neighbouring property, please call Denis, at 306-220-8996. Denis is conducting site visits and will be going around to all yard sites doing inspections. Rat poison can be picked up at the office during regular business hours.

Spring Ratepayers Supper

After much discussion, Council feels it would be in the best interest of the ratepayers to postpone the Annual Ratepayers Supper usually scheduled in April, due to the concerns surrounding COVID-19. The new date is still to be determined.

Ratepayers \$120 per hour - \$60.00 Minimum Charge plus PST.

Non Ratepayers & Developers \$160 per hour- \$80.00 Minimum Charge. Work Authorization Form must be filled out before any work will be performed. *If you rely on the rural municipality for custom work, please note that the rural municipality's policy is to clear all roads first before any private custom work is done.*

Spring Weight Restrictions

The spring weight bans are now in effect. Hauling heavy semis or equipment on roads that are soft can create a large amount of damage to the roadway. Any costs incurred to repair damaged roads will be charged back to anyone caught damaging the municipal roads. Be advised that Drews Rd, Old 27 Rd, and Bettker Rd all have 10 ton limits.

Transfer Station

The Aberdeen Transfer Station will remain open at this time, with some minor changes to operations. To ensure the health and safety of our Transfer Station Attendant during the Covid-19 pandemic, the attendant has been instructed to limit interactions with the public.

Keeping animals within your property is the responsibility of the owner. If your animals are roaming within the RM, steps can be taken to detain the animals and all costs incurred in doing so will be the responsibility of the animals' owner.

COUNCIL'S CORNER

Town Council meetings are open to the public. We meet at the TOWN OF ABERDEEN Office Chambers, 401C Main Street, 7:00 pm usually every 3rd Tuesday of the Month. Our next council meeting is scheduled for Tuesday May 19, 2020.



Any Delegations wishing to address Council are required to complete a **Delegations Policy form** and have it submitted to the Town Office no later than the Thursday prior to Council meeting date. You may obtain these from the Town Office. These forms are also available on our website www.aberdeen.ca

URGENT: When using disinfectant wipes please know that the wastewater plant CANNOT process them. They need to be disposed of in the garbage, not flushed down toilets. Wipes, including baby wipes, napkins, paper towels and tissues are clogging up pumps and equipment at the wastewater treatment plant.

Over time, back lanes can deteriorate, forming ruts, pot holes and low spots due to an extreme change in weather conditions, regular vehicle traffic, drainage from private properties, overgrown vegetation, and large equipment.

- To prevent deterioration of your back lane, residents should trim back any overgrown trees on their property.
- Our equipment is getting lights broken, windshield cracks, and other damage from these large branches.
- To assist our maintenance staff, residents should avoid adding topsoil or other materials along the fence/property line so that operators have full view of any potential hazards that could damage equipment or fences.

Please DO NOT leave any items in the alley.

All new buildings and additions greater than 100 square feet in building area are required to meet the National Energy Code of Canada. There is a 3-page form that needs to be filled out when you take out your building and development permits. This 3-page form is not required for unheated detached garages or sheds.

Building Permits are required prior to construction beginning for:

- All New Dwellings, Garage, Sheds – 100 sq ft & over (10x10 or larger), Decks, Additions, Basement Development, Structural changes to existing buildings.

2020 MONTHLY TAX DISCOUNTS / PENALTIES:

Payments received in January 6.5% discount
Payments received in February 5.5% discount
Payments received in March 4% discount
Payments received in April 3% discount
Payments received in May 2% discount
Payments received in June 1% discount
Payments received in July .5% discount

On January 1, 2020 a 12% penalty will be applied to 2019 arrears

Taxes are imposed the first day of January in each year and are due July 31.

Please remember there is NO discount for the School Portion of Taxes

Tax Estimate Notices for 2020 taxes were sent in December 2019. 2020 Tax Notices will be sent mid May, once the School Division levies have been established and the Municipal Mill Rate has been set.

In light of the Covid19 pandemic we will be closing the Town Office to the public from Friday, March 20, 2020, to indefinitely. We have a sign on the door asking to drop payments in the mail slot in Ziplock bags, or phone/email from home with any questions.

We are encouraging residents who have not yet signed up for e-billing or on line/e-transfer to do so. We can now email your receipts. Please email the Town office to set it up - townaberdeen@sasktel.net

Thank you to those who already receive their utility bills by email.

We will continue to have staff in the office during these dates from 9:00am - 12:00pm and 1:00pm - 5:00pm to answer any questions by telephone, text or email only. Our Maintenance Staff will not be interacting with the public but will continue with their duties as needed, so please if you have any questions of them, again direct them to the Town Office. For the March Utility billing we will not be reading meters but prepare an estimate only. We ask those that do not send payments by e-transfer or online banking to wait the 2 weeks to pay their bill so we don't need to visit the bank during this time. This could cause a family member to unsafely arrive at a scene and put our emergency workers at risk. As well, police notifications are done compassionately with support resources available. Any posts should only say avoid area, or traffic detoured, slowed etc.

Be safe, it's finally warming up!



SMOKE ALARMS

Smoke Alarms are the first line of defense against toxic smoke and a deadly fire. The sound of a Smoke Alarm is your warning to leave the building. By developing and regularly practicing a fire escape plan, you will be prepared to react correctly if a fire strikes.

Smoke Alarms will only work if a charged battery is installed. Here are a few helpful hints to maintain a working smoke alarm:

- Smoke alarms belong on the ceiling of every level of the home, more the better. Install them in the basement, entrance way, hallway, and/or even in every bedroom.
- The sound of a smoke alarm usually means smoke danger.
- Clean the smoke alarm yearly. This can be done with a simple wipe with a damp cloth, vacuum or use of can air.
- Replace the battery in the smoke alarm every year. Before installing a new battery, write the date on it so you know when the year is up.
- Test your smoke alarm. This should be done yearly by pushing the test button on the alarm. If you cannot reach the alarm DO NOT stand on a chair, use a broom handle to reach the test button. If alarm does not sound replace the battery. If alarm still does not sound, replace the smoke alarm. Nothing is made to last forever.
- Replace your smoke alarm every 10 years. Smoke Alarms will have an expiry date on the back or inside the alarm.

We are here to help. If you are not sure on what or how to do a test or have any questions, please contact any of the local fire fighters or contact Adrien Hamoline at 306-230-1603.

Remember, Smoke Alarms can only warn you when they are working.

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
