## Bylaw Beat:

### Bylaw 2018-01 – A Bylaw to Restrict the Placement of Snow Cleared from Private Lands on Roads

When clearing snow from private property, including but not limited to driveways, snow shall **not** be piled:

- On the road way
- Anywhere within the road allowance, including the ditch, to a height higher than one (1) foot below the lowest part of the roadway

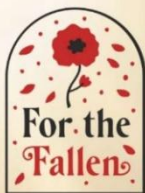
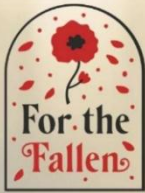

# Lest We Forget

## Policy Post: Approach Development Policy

A development permit is required to add a new approach, widen an approach, or remove an existing approach.

Every quarter section is entitled to have one approach. Quarter sections of land with a residence are permitted to have two approaches. Residences in a Country Residential Development are only permitted to have one approach unless granted special permission by Council.

Unauthorized or non-conforming approaches may result in remediation or removal by the RM at the cost of the landowner.

**No work shall take place on the municipal road allowance without the consent of the RM.**

## Building Permits:

All structures or buildings over **100ft<sup>2</sup>** require a building permit. Houses or additions require permits regardless of their square footage.

All buildings must adhere to the setbacks in our Zoning Bylaw. The zoning of your property will determine the required setbacks.

## 2026 Business Licenses

According to Bylaw 12/14 the Business License Bylaw, all Home Based, Store Front and Contractor Business Licenses for 2026 are due December 31, 2025, and are valid until December 31, 2026.

License fees:

Home Based Business \$25 annually

Store Front Business \$75 annually

Contractor \$100 annually

General Contractor \$300 (covers the trades, as part of the building permit)

**The offence for conducting business without a Business License is \$200. Bylaw Enforcement will be issuing fines for non-compliance.**

## It's never too early for a SNOW REMOVAL PLAN

Snow removal will be done on roadways from Monday thru Friday, and weekends by necessity only. Sand/gravel will be spread on streets and corners where icy, and as needed to help diminish potential risks to our residents and vehicular traffic.

**Priority 1:** School Route – Central Avenue, Main Street, Second Avenue and Thompson Street

**Priority 2:** Emergency Services – Industrial Drive, Fifth Avenue South

**Priority 3:** Residential Streets, Main Street Sidewalk

**Priority 4:** Alleys where required.

Back alleys are Town property and **NOT** a storage area! Bylaw Enforcement will be visiting any property owners who have left items in the alley. Please clear your back alley before snow falls for proper snow removal.

### Bylaw Enforcement

Commencing immediately, Bylaw Enforcement will be conducted by the CAO. The Office of the Administrator will commence much in the same process as which was previously followed starting with a warning letter and/or-email due to Canada Post. These warning letters provide the owners with notice of the Bylaw in which they are in contravention of as well as a time frame to correct before being issued fine(s) and/or orders to remedy.

While we understand that receiving these letters may leave a 'sour taste' in a resident's mouth, the Office staff are more than happy to answer any questions you may have regarding the letter.

Please note- There is ZERO TOLERANCE for harassment and/or abuse to staff. While we understand you may be upset, please treat us with the same respect we treat you.

### UPDATES:



- The Water Pumphouse has seen substantial changes within these last few months including the backfill around the new reservoir and most recently, the building of the new plant. We should see the finalization of the exterior of the building within the next few weeks. After this, while the location may look dormant, work will be commencing on the inside of the plant. We are looking forward to the anticipated progress as it continues.

# ABERDEEN & DISTRICT FIRE AND RESCUE

## Fire Prevention Week – October 5-11, 2025. “Charge Into Fire Safety”

We took this opportunity to educate Kindergarten to Grade 3 students at Aberdeen Composite School how to be fire safe. The more people who become fire safe, the less fires we will have in Saskatchewan. We are impressed with the growing display of awareness in children and their homes.

Edward Wutzke was awarded Fire Chief for a Day. Edward was picked up for school in the fire truck and then taken home at the end of the day in the fire truck. Edward also got a few extra prizes.

It is important to develop a home fire escape plan today....it could save your life tonight. Everyone must know what to do and where to when the smoke alarm sounds. Take a few minutes with everyone in your household to make a home fire escape plan.

- **Draw a floor plan of your home**
- **Include all possible emergency exits**
- **Show two ways out of every room, if possible.**
- **Does anyone need help to escape?**
- **Choose a meeting place outside**
- **Call 9-1-1 from outside your home**
- **Practice your escape**
- **Get out and stay out**

Our department again handed out a number of smoke alarms during the presentation. Smoke alarms are vital to fire safety at home. They are the best line of defence to alert your family to evacuate. They save lives!

During Fire Prevention Week, we also welcomed a school tour, and enjoyed a visit to a local daycare.

It is important to ensure every area of your home is covered by a smoke alarm. A fire can start in any room. To increase your chances of escaping safely, follow these tips from the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency:

- Install smoke alarms in every bedroom and outside each sleeping area.
- Install smoke alarms on every level of your home.
- Test smoke alarms using the test button at least once a month or as recommended by the manufacturer.
- Change the battery at least once a year. If the alarm chirps regularly, this is the signal for a low-battery and/or the unit needs to be changed.
- Follow the manufacturer’s instructions for cleaning. Keeping your smoke alarm clean makes a big difference.
- Check the age of your smoke alarm. If it is 10 years or older, it needs to be replaced.
- Immediately replace any smoke alarm that does not respond properly when tested.
- Make sure everyone in the home recognizes the sound of a smoke alarm – a loud beeping sound means smoke (or carbon monoxide) is present.
- Get out, call 911, and stay out.
- Use smoke alarms that can be interconnected by hard-wiring or wireless technology. When one interconnected smoke alarm sounds, every smoke alarm in the building will sound.

The most effective and natural way to teach children about fire safety is to set a good example when you’re using things like matches, lighters, candles, fireplaces, campfires, etc. If you always use a fire source in a safe manner, the greater the chances of children understanding that they are not toys.

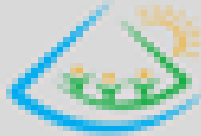

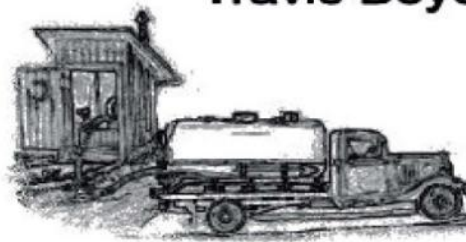

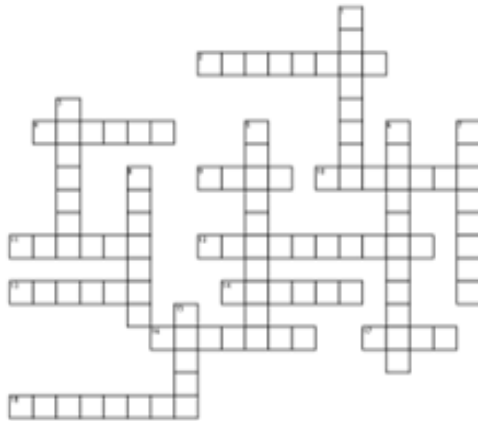
